Aim

The purpose of the preparatory workshop is to discuss political and social developments in France, and especially in the Marseille region, and the question how they shape the general conditions of cultural and citizenship education. The exchange and its findings will be incorporated into the design of the programme of the NECE Conference 2018, to be held in Marseille, 6–9 September, 2018.

Players from the fields of politics, administration, culture, education, science and the media in France as well as relevant civil society organisations from the Marseille region are invited to enter into a dialogue on the forms and conditions of citizenship education in France, with particular attention to the south of France.

The NECE network is seeking an exchange with civil society organisations from the Marseille region: What influence do they have in view of the many challenges in this city characterized by social inequalities and multicultural tensions? Which topics and issues are relevant for organisations at the grassroots level? Which approaches are chosen to communicate them to different target groups?
